Parkinson's Disease

Parkinson's Disease is a brain disorder, that causes uncontrollable movements, such as shaking, stiffness and difficulty with balance and coordination. Symptoms usually begin gradually and worsen over time. As the disease progresses, people may have difficulty walking and talking. They may also have mental and behavioral changes, sleep problem, depression, memory difficulties and tiredness. Anyone could beat risk for developing Parkinson's Disease. Research studies suggest this- disease affects more men than women. One clear risk factor is age. Although most people with Parkinson's first develop the disease after age 60. About 5% to 10%, experience symptoms before the age of 50. The beginning of Parkinson's is often, but not always inherited. Some forms have been linked to specific alterations in genes from environmental toxins. **CAUSES:** The signs and symptoms of Parkinson's Disease, occur when nerve cells (neurons) in the brain that control movements, become impaired or dies. Normally, these neurons produce an important brain chemical known as dopamine. When some of the brain's neurons, die or become impaired they produce less dopamine. This causes the movement problems. People with Parkinson's Disease suffer with irregular sudden drop in blood pressure. Occurring when a person stands up from a sitting or lying position, causing severe dizziness with falling possibilities. The symptoms of Parkinson's and the rate of progression differ among individuals.

SYMPTOMS often begin on one side of the body or even in one limb on one side of the body. As the disease progresses, it will eventually affect both sides. However, the symptoms maybe more severe on one side more than on the other side. *There is no cure for Parkinson's Disease.* Medication is the primary treatment for Parkinson's. There are other treatments that can help control symptoms. Physical, occupational and speech therapies also deep brain stimulation, for people not responding to medications.




