

<u>Viral Hepatitis: A, B, C, D, E</u>


Viral hepatitis is an infection that can cause liver inflammation and damage. Inflammation is swelling that occurs when tissues of the body become injured or infected. There are several different types of viral hepatitis, classified as A, B, C, D, E. Viral hepatitis A is a short-term infection which means, the immune system helps people by get better without treatment after a few weeks. It is spread by contaminated water or food involving an infected person with the virus. Viral hepatitis B in the acute phase, is a short-term infection. It may last for several weeks and in some cases, symptoms may last up to six months. In the United States, Asian Americans and African Americans have a higher rate of chronic hepatitis B than any other ethnic groups. This is due to sharing drug needles or having unprotected sex. Viral Hepatitis C can be acute or chronic infection. Although no vaccine for viral hepatitis C is available. There are medications that can cure most cases of viral hepatitis C. It is spread from person to person by infected blood contact. Viral hepatitis D is unusual because it can only infect you, when you have hepatitis B viral infection. In this way, hepatitis D is a double infection. You can protect yourself from getting hepatitis D, by getting the hepatitis B vaccine. Viral hepatitis D is spread the same way as viral hepatitis B, though contact with a person's infected blood or other infected body fluids.

Viral hepatitis E has different types that are spread in different ways. One way of spreading is by drinking contaminated water. This type is common in developing countries such as parts of Africa, Asia, Central America, and the Middle East. Another type is more common in developed countries such as the United States, Australia, Japan, parts of Europe and East Asia. This type is infected occasionally from eating under cooked pork or wild game such as deer or possum and shellfish. The greatest symptom they all have is jaundice – yellowing of skin and eyes.


