## Some Valuable Nuggets on Forgiveness Ephesians 4:32 (Part 6)

### A. BIBLICAL FORGIVENESS IS THE DECISION.

Here are the Other Aspects of Forgiveness:

### 2. To refuse to bring up the offense to use against the offender.

When God says that He will not remember our sins any more (**Heb. 8:12; 10:17**), He does not forget them in the sense of amnesia. Rather, He means that He will not bring up any of our offenses against us in the future.

We do not have to fear standing before Him someday, because there is now no condemnation for us in Christ (**Rom. 8:1**). To forgive someone is to promise not to bring the matter

up again to use against him. Sometimes it is necessary to bring up a forgiven sin for the purpose of teaching or restoration. Sometimes it is proper to impose consequences to teach the seriousness of sin, as God did with David after his sin with Bathsheba (**2 Sam. 12:9-14**). It may be proper for a forgiven offender to be required to make restitution. If he committed a crime, he may need to be prosecuted and spend time in prison. But when we forgive him, we should not bring up his sin to accuse or condemn him or to win an argument.

### 3. To refuse to think about the offense.

Thankfully, God is not in heaven rehearsing our forgiven sins every day! For us, this is one of the most difficult aspects of forgiveness, especially when the wrong was serious. But we must distinctly remember to forget past wrongs that we have chosen to forgive.

#### Vaccine pause showed system's strength

The “CDC advises against heparin therapy if platelet factor four antibody test is positive,” she said. “If PL4 test is positive, use of non-heparin anticoagulants and high dose intravenous immune globulin should be considered. Hematology consultation is also advised.”

After a thorough review, ACIP lifted the J&J Janssen vaccine pause April 23.

AMA President Susan R. Bailey, MD, commended ACIP for “reaffirming its recommendation on the use of the Janssen COVID-19 vaccine” for those 18 or older under the FDA’s emergency use authorization. “The population-level data presented during ACIP’s meeting ... clearly demonstrates that the benefits of this approach outweigh the risks,” she said.

“The pause on the Janssen COVID-19 vaccine has demonstrated the strength of our nation’s vaccine safety monitoring system and the transparent and careful deliberations by the ACIP should raise confidence in FDA-authorized and CDC-recommended COVID-19 vaccines,” Dr. Bailey added.
