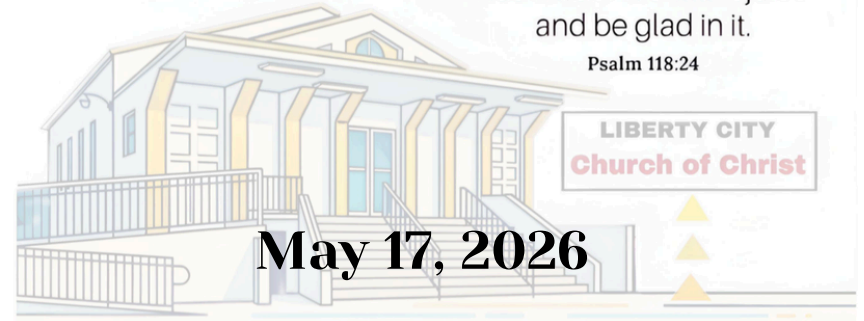

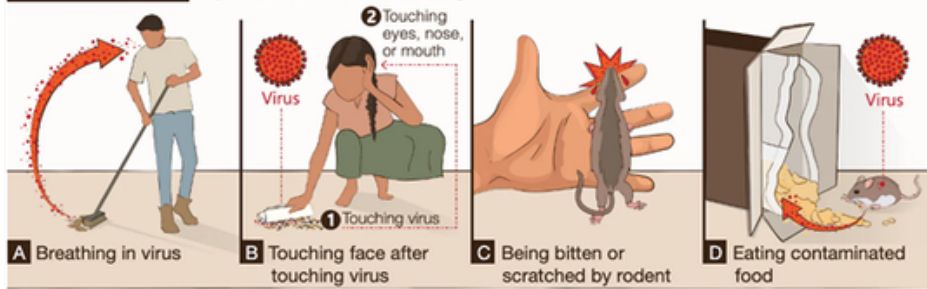

TRANSMISSION: A person can be infected by



Hantavirus refers to a group of viruses mainly spread by infected rodents (rats). Humans can become infected through contact with rats: urine, saliva, or a person breath in contaminated dust particles from droppings. There are several airborne ways to inhale contaminated dust particles, by disturbing and stirring up dust areas where there are rat infected droppings. (1) sweeping (2) vacuuming (3) moving long term isolated boxes, wood or furniture where rats nested. Also, you can be infected by rat bites.

GOOD TO KNOW: The virus survives for a limited time in the environment, but cool enclosed, poorly ventilated spaces can increase risk, because contaminated dust can accumulate. The CDC reported the best way to protect yourself from hantavirus, keep rats out of your home. There are ways to prevent rats appearance, by closing all gaps or holes in your home. Keeping food well sealed and putting garbage in thick containers with thick tight lids. Remember, when cleaning rat droppings, use gloves, spray the waste with a bleach solution and wait for five minutes, before wiping the area with paper towels and disposing of them safely.

At first, hantavirus can feel like the flu. A person may suffer from fatigue, nausea or vomiting, chills and fever with body aches. Also nasal congestion with coughing and sneezing. After exposure, symptoms can take one to eight weeks to develop. But as the virus continues, it can damage the heart, lungs or kidneys. A person can suffer severe shortness of breath, organ failure or even death. According to the CDC, there is no specific treatment for hantavirus. But a person's symptoms can be treated with oxygen, rest, fluids and medications. Because of this, protect yourself from hantavirus.
