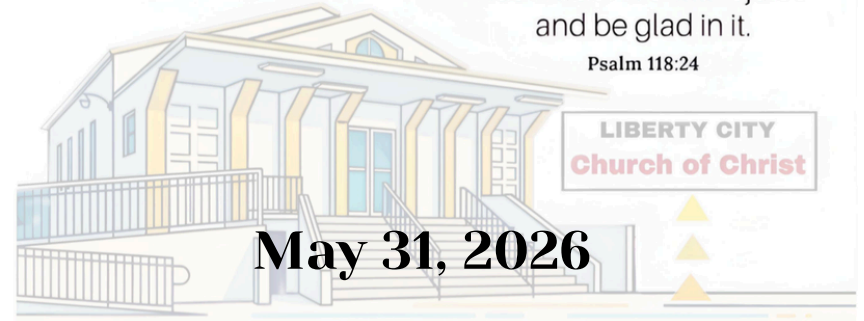

EBOLA VIRUS

Signs and Symptoms of Ebola Virus



Ebola is a viral infection that damage your blood vessels. This disease can cause serious illness, without treatment will cause death. Unlike the other three circulating viruses, Ebola is more body damaging. Here is the big difference: Ebola does not mainly target one or two organs. Instead it affects multiple systems throughout the body. Meaning – Ebola damage blood vessels making them leak blood and cause problems with the blood clotting factor. Ebola also weaken the body's immune system. **GOOD TO KNOW:** Not everyone with Ebola has visible bleeding, but the virus can cause widespread internal damage and fluid loss throughout the body. Affecting the liver, kidneys, the digestive system, brain and nervous system. According to The World Health Organization (WHO), Ebola was discovered in the Congo and Sub-Saharan, in Africa during 1976. It came into the human population, when people had close contact with an infected animal's blood, secretions or other bodily fluids. Referring to monkeys, bats, gorillas, chimpanzees, that was found ill or dead in the forest.

People can get infected with the virus from another person, by direct contact through broken skin with the invasion of the virus into the mucous membranes (nose, mouth, eyes and digestive tract). This occurs when a person comes in contact with contaminated blood or other bodily fluids, from a sick person or from a person who died from Ebola. Another way to become infected, is by touching the surfaces that has been contaminated with bodily fluids from an infected person. Life expectancy of a virus outside the host can range from several hours to 2 – 3 days. *Symptoms include* – fever, weakness, difficult breathing, skin rash with red spots, vomiting or diarrhea with possible blood and bloodshot eyes. When symptoms occur, notify your doctor.
